ITEM/ HAZARD	CONTROL MEASURES
Equipment failure	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Equipment to be checked before use. ▪ Equipment to be used in accordance with manufacturer's instructions.
Members of the public	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Group to be advised on expected behaviour when sharing campsites with members of the public. ▪ Interaction between the group and members of the public to be avoided unless under the direct supervision of a member of staff.
Loss of participants	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Group leader or Centre staff to be on site, supervising under 18s. ▪ Brief participants about site layout. Advise them of areas which are 'out of bounds'. ▪ Agree signals to indicate immediate return to campsite, e.g. repeated short bursts on whistle. ▪ If participants leave from the main group for an agreed reason, give a time limitation for return. ▪ With the exception of DofE Expeditions group leaders or Centre staff to camp overnight in the same area as participants. ▪ Inform participants and leaders where staff tents are in case of an incident / emergency
Injury from fires, Barbecues or camp cookers	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Cooking is not to be undertaken by participants under the age of 18 unless closely supervised by the group leader or as part of an DofE expedition. ▪ Cooking to take place a minimum of 5m away from tents ▪ Campfires in designated campfire areas only. ▪ Heating and lighting to be provided by means which have no naked flames and no risk of starting a fire. ▪ Fire extinguishers or buckets of water to be at hand in the event of fire.
Falling objects	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Tents not to be pitched under trees whenever possible. ▪ If camping off site pitching under a tree only to be done if absolutely necessary and if the supervisor deems it suitable.
Tripping or slipping	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Camping area to be kept tidy with clear paths between tents. ▪ Location of guy ropes to be pointed out to participants. ▪ Tents must not be pitched on thoroughfares.

Further risks	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ All risks should be minimised by continual appraisal of participants' condition, the environment and equipment through dynamic risk assessment by the staff members involved.▪ Some risks still remain but every care must be taken to minimise these.
