HAZARD	CONTROL MEASURES
Manual Handling	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Follow recommended procedure to safely move the KataKanu</li> <li>▪ Where necessary ask for help to move them.</li> <li>▪ At least 2 people recommended for safe move on and off the trailer</li> <li>▪ Use the trolley supplied with the KataKanu to easily move the canoe around.</li> <li>▪ See manual handling risk assessment for further details</li> </ul>
Instructor paddling with the group in the KataKanu	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Instructor to make sure they carry a throw line to allow them to rescue from a distance.</li> <li>▪ Instructor to ensure they are able to easily move around the KataKanu to help people back into the boat.</li> <li>▪ Instructor to be aware of the lack of manoeuvrability of the craft in case of rescues.</li> </ul>
Use of 2 KataKanus with the instructor on one of them.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Instructor in charge must hold a minimum of Paddlesport Instructor or Level 1 Coaches with internal sign off for Canoeing.</li> <li>▪ Instructor can paddle a separate canoe to allow them to easily move from boat to boat to perform rescues and coach</li> <li>▪ If instructor is on one KataKanu they should be aware of their manoeuvrability and their proximity to the other KataKanu in case of rescues.</li> <li>▪ A throw line must be on board with the Instructor.</li> </ul>
